The Museum of the American Revolution is offering free civics and history classes to help green card holders/permanent residents prepare for the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services naturalization exam.

PARTICIPANTS Anyone who is considering taking the U.S. Citizenship Test. Classes will be accessible for intermediate-level English language learners.

DESCRIPTION A series of interactive classes that will use historical objects, paintings and stories showcased in the Museum to teach the history and civics sections of the Citizenship Test.
